Michael O'Hearn, PE Biography | Mr. O'Hearn is an environmental engineer and senior consultant with Amec Environment & Infrastructure Solutions in Novi, Michigan. He currently provides technical guidance to project teams and advises clients on cost-effective strategies for compliance with Michigan's environmental management regulations.

Mike has worked on well over 600 environmental assessment and remediation projects in Michigan and across the U.S. during his 38-year career. He has been closely tracking changes to Michigan's environmental cleanup programs for over 10 years, and has provided peer review in several technical areas, including vapor intrusion. In recognition of his technical expertise and his understanding of Michigan's environmental cleanup regulations, Mike was appointed to two

consecutive terms on the state's Response Activities Review Panel. The panel was created by the State Legislature to accelerate the pace of cleanups at environmentally impacted properties by helping decision makers understand and resolve disputes that may arise during implementation of the state's environmental cleanup programs.

Mike has a B.Sc. in Environmental Engineering from California State University (Humboldt) and is a registered Professional Engineer in Michigan, Illinois, and Florida. He has been a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers for over 30 years, a member of the Michigan Chamber of Commerce's Energy and Environmental Policy Advisory Committee for 15 years, and previously served as President of the Michigan Association of Environmental Professionals.
